

Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we move towards the end of week 4 the school continues to be positive, with students engaged in their learning. A highlight of my day is visiting classrooms and the playground and observing the students following the Gowrie Values of Be Safe, Be Respectful, Be Responsible and Be a Learner.

The **COVID-19** situation in the ACT remains positive, with zero cases and an announcement late last week that there would be an easing of some further restrictions for Canberra businesses. These restrictions don't directly impact on schools. There has been no change to current COVID-19 restrictions in schools. Schools will continue to limit the number of adults on school grounds, but where scheduled events are planned such as one-on-one parent/teacher interviews or small assemblies of less than 100 people, parents can attend the school. It remains important that records are kept of visitors entering the school so contact tracing can occur if required. Any further changes will be considered in line with COVID-19 restrictions across the broader Canberra community and on the advice of the ACT Chief Health Officer.

Today we opened the school Canteen for the first time in over 12 months. The Canteen will be open on Wednesday's, Thursdays and Fridays. The canteen is privately run by Mel Donnell. The canteen is called Mel's Canteen. Mel currently is already serving 3 other schools in Canberra. She has created a very exciting menu for us here.

The Drop Off and Set down areas in the school car park continue to run smoothly. I would like to thank everybody for their patience and efforts to ensure that the system is smooth and efficient. As always student safety is our priority.

Finally, a reminder to all students, that any valuables including mobile phones and any other electrical equipment, should be handed to the front office staff on arrival to school and collected at the conclusion of the day. This will ensure the safety of all equipment throughout the day. However, we encourage students to leave their electronic belongings at home. The only exception to this is if students have specific permission/ arrangements with their classroom teacher for educational purposes. We also encourage students to leave toys at home to prevent the loss or damage of them.

Author Visit

Book Week for 2020 has officially been moved to October this year however at Gowrie we will still celebrate with an Author Visit. The K – Year 2 students will have Canberra Author Samantha Tidy visit them on Tuesday 25 August. Samantha is the author of *The Day We Built the Bridge and Our Bush Capital*. Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) – Free & Frequent Rewards

Regular staff meetings throughout the year are used to identify and refine our expected behaviours in all areas of the school to ensure that we are working collectively as a school community to instil the positive behaviours in our students of We are Safe, We are Respectful and We are Responsible Learners. This term we are focused on our free and frequent reward system on our playground. Students receive a ticket on the playground from the duty teacher for displaying positive behaviours and this is added to a box at the Front Office where a tally is kept. If the students receive more than 300 positive tickets the students are rewarded with extra playtime at the end of the term.

National Science Week - Young Stars program - Measuring gravity across the ACT, with kids aged 6+

The 'Young Stars' program is running a free community science experiment in National Science Week on Saturday 22 August, 1-3 pm, for kids aged 6+ living in the ACT. Since 2016, the program has brought together more than 50 kids to explore the worlds of astronomy, astrophysics and science on ANU Campus.

During Science Week, Young Stars will host an online DIY experiment to Measure gravity across the ACT using simple pendulums. To register for this exciting family event please go to the Measuring Gravity event link. All apparatus for the experiment will be provided to registered participants. Please note, parental supervision is required to avoid hazards related to small parts.

In Brindabella this term exciting things are happening. Mrs Lawrie has broken her back and is having Wednesday's off. This means that K-2L are in their peer classes on a Wednesday doing exciting things like science and maths.

In our classroom, we have been focusing on narrative writing. We have looked at the structure of writing narratives with a focus on fairy tales.

First, we read the Gingerbread Man. We looked at the action words (verbs) and nouns. We rewrote the story together as a class and designed our own gingerbread men.

On Friday, we cooked gingerbread and had our foxes eat it all up in a roleplay of the story.





We moved onto the three little pigs, walking about the structure of the story. Who the characters were, what happened first, what happened next, and how the story ended. We loved role playing this story and discovering how the characters felt.
