Public Health Alert: protect against mosquito bites – message for school newsletters

The ACT Health Directorate has alerted the Canberra and surrounding community to protect themselves against mosquito bites. Japanese encephalitis virus (JEV) has been detected in samples from pigs in commercial pig farms at locations in regional New South Wales, northern Victoria and southern Queensland, indicating the virus is likely circulating in the mosquito population.

It is expected that many of the upcoming batch of RATs to be delivered to schools are likely to be nasal tests rather than the saliva test.

Stranger Safety

This is reminder to help our children understand the importance of stranger safety and the need to report any unusual incidents or approaches to staff immediately.

If you become aware of an incident, or notice anyone acting suspiciously around a school or child, contact police immediately on 131 444 or in the case of an emergency call 000. If you witness incidents or if you have any information that could assist Police, contact Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000. Information can be provided anonymously.

Please support us to keep our children safe by having conversations about moving safely around the community and what to do if they ever feel unsafe. The Constable Kenny website also has a number of tips for parents.

Speech and Language Development Parent Workshop (online)

The Tuggeranong Allied Health Team is delivering a *Speech and Language Development* workshop. The session will be facilitated by Kenny Nguyen - Speech Pathologist. The session aims to provide information about speech and language development in the Early Years and offers information to parents regarding services available to support and promote speech and oral language skills of their children. Kindergarten health checks

Canberra Health Services offer all children in kindergarten in the ACT a health check at their school during the first year of fulltime education (kindergarten). These checks include an ACT Health questionnaire answered by parents/guardians, as well as a health check provided by a Registered Nurse that includes vision, hearing, height, and weight. Nurses send the results of the health check to parents and to the student's GP if one is nominated. This year, kindergarten health checks will take place at Gowrie Primary on Thursday 17 March.

BASE Early Years Assessment Program – Kindergarten

All students in kindergarten will be involved in the BASE Assessment from **Tuesday 15 March to Friday 25 March**. It will assess their competence in early literacy and numeracy skills. The testing will be completed through an online portal. BASE captures baseline data at the beginning of the year, supplies data on the expected and actual progress of a student at the end of the year, and provides the classroom teacher with concrete evidence on the spread of abilities within a class. The assessment is repeated at the end of the year and measures student growth and progress across the first year of formal schooling.

COVID-19 vaccination social scripts: a resource for families who have children with autism

Amaze and the National Disability Services have developed social scripts that outline the process of getting a COVID-19 vaccination. These social scripts provide autistic people with an opportunity to prepare themselves for their vaccination and reduce anxiety. Social scripts are stories and images that explain new experiences and social environments.

While the social scripts have been developed for autistic people, anyone who is feeling anxious about the process of getting a COVID-19 vaccination can use and benefit from the resources. Lambrigg News






















Lanyon News


Google Classroom
