## Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

#### **COVID Update**

Following the further easing of COVID-19 restrictions across the ACT, the Education Directorate has worked with ACT Health to review the <u>term 1 plan</u> that sets out measures in place to minimise the transmission of COVID-19 in ACT public schools.

From 21 March, school bands, orchestras, choirs and performance rehearsals will be able to resume without our students needing to remain in their cohorts.

School sports can also resume without cohorting restrictions.

From term 2, swimming carnivals and school sports competitions can resume off school grounds. Parents are welcome to attend these events when they are held outdoors however, it is recommended they do not attend carnivals or competitions that are indoors.

Interstate excursions will also be allowed for trips within a 4-hour driving distance to the ACT.

Overnight excursions can also resume with a two-night limit for interstate excursions. Schools will need to prepare a COVID-safe plan for each excursion.

Parents can continue to attend the school with a booked appointment to meet with teachers and other staff. However, at this point the Directorate has assessed that the additional risk of COVID-19 transmission as a result of parents being on site is not manageable for the remainder of term 1.

#### Pick up and drop off

In line with the easing of restrictions Gowrie Primary will be moving back to a 3:00pm pick up for all students. Students who have siblings in either the Rosellas or the Gecko's are still welcome to be picked up from the preschool. However, this will now happen at 3:00pm in line with all other pick-up arrangements. Lambrigg and Lanyon students will now exit the school using the side gate.

#### **Gowrie Gathering**

As of 4<sup>th</sup> April Week 10, we will recommence Gowrie Gathering. Students are to move to the back court area where we will hold an outdoor assembly for the students only. At this assembly we will be outside and sitting in co-horts and will continue to follow COVID restrictions/ plans. This will occur on all Mondays, weather permitting.

Again, I would like to thank the entire community for the ongoing support. While it is very difficult times for all the strength of our community has kept as moving forward as a school in a very positive direction.

## Deputy Principal's Message

#### Message from the Deputy Principal

Autumn is here and it's hard to believe we are more than halfway through the first term of 2022! I believe that this is probably the longest that children have been in face-to-face learning since August last year and it is obvious that they love being back with their friends and teachers at Gowrie!

#### Understanding and responding to Feelings and Behaviours Program (UR FaB)

UR FAB is an early intervention program run in collaboration with the ACT Education Directorate for children in primary school, their parents and teachers. It aims to support all children to understand their big emotions and behaviour. It offers extra support through a group work program for those children who struggle with managing strong emotions and their behaviour at school and at home and learn new ways of doing things and problem solve. Some children who participate in the program find it difficult to manage their angry or frustrated feelings, while other children find it difficult to manage their anxiety, worried or sad feelings.

Research suggests that there are many benefits from teaching children about their emotions at an early age and that helping families and schools to work together in the early years of primary school can have positive results for children who struggle with these difficulties.

We are offering the UR FaB Program for a small group of children and their families in the Year 1/2. A short list is made of the eligible children informed by screening results and parent/teacher interview. An 8 week group program will be offered to these families. If you think the program would be of benefit to your family and would like some more information, please contact the Front Office.

#### Speech and Language Development Parent Workshop

Kenny Nguyen from the Tuggeranong Allied Health Team delivered a *Speech and Language* **Development Parent** workshop which provided information about speech and language development in the Early Years and offered information to parents regarding services available to support and promote speech and oral language skills of their children. He shared the Speech Pathology Australia's Communication Milestones Poster for 1-5 year olds. 




The School Photographer will be at school on

### **2023 Enrolment News**

#### How do I enrol for 2023?

Enrolments for the 2023 school year will open on 26 April 2022 at 6am. You can submit an enrolment application using the online enrolment form from 26 April 2022. https://www.education.act.gov.au/public-school-life/enrolling-in-a-public-school

#### Who makes enrolment decisions?

Enrolment decisions are made by the Principal of the school, with policies, procedures and support provided by the Education Directorate.

### When can my child start school/preschool?

If your child turns four on or before 30 April, they can start preschool the first day of term 1 that year. If your child turns four after 30 April, they can start preschool the first day of term 1 the following year. If your child turns five on or before 30 April, they can start Kindergarten the first day of term 1 that year. If your child turns five after 30 April, they can start Kindergarten the first day of term 1 the following year. Use the handy calculator to work out when your child can start school.

# I am applying late for Preschool 2022. Do I need to call other schools to find out if there is capacity?

No, you do not need to call other schools. Please submit an application to your preferred school who will assess the application, taking into account available capacity at the time of applying. If your preferred school is unable to offer a place, they will forward to the PEA school, or the nearest school with available capacity. You will then receive an offer of place.

#### Can I put my name on a waitlist?

Schools do not maintain waiting lists. If we are unable to offer a place, your application will be forwarded to a school with available capacity and an offer will be made from that school. Regardless of where a student attends preschool, they will continue to be guaranteed a place at their local school for kindergarten onwards.

## Will I need to reapply for kindergarten if my child is currently attending Gowrie Preschool?

Only pre-schoolers living outside of the suburb of Gowrie with no siblings attending Gowrie Primary school will need to submit an enrolment application for kindergarten.

#### **Students Graduating Year 6.**

If your child is graduating Year 6 in 2022 you will need to submit an application to your preferred high school who will assess the application, taking into account available capacity at the time of applying. If your preferred school is unable to offer a place, they will forward to the PEA school, or the nearest school with available capacity. You will then receive an offer of place.
